Finished Size: 48 1/2" x 64" Block Size: 7 3/4" 7 3/4"

This quilt is a lot of fun to make and can be pulled together easily from a mix of your favorite color way - It's a dream if you happen to have a sizeable stash. Many of my quilts contain more fabrics than the requirements call for – I always enjoy throwing an extra print or two in from my stash just to spice things up. The requirements below list the necessary yardage as well as the total number of rectangles needed if you choose to work from your stash. Enjoy!

SUPPLIES: Suggested Pattern: Inferno

Sewing machine in good working order Basic rotary cutting and sewing supplies 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" square ruler – or larger OPTIONAL: 2 yds white flannel for design wall

Materials

- 6 fat quarters light red OR a variety of 18 rectangles, 9" x 13"
- 6 fat quarters medium red OR a variety of 18 rectangles, 9" x 13"
- 4 fat quarters dark red OR a variety of 12 rectangles, 9" x 13"
- 1/4 yard each of 3 different black and white prints
- 1/4 yard each of 3 different white and black prints
- 1/3 yard fabric for inner sashing border
- 1/2 yard fabric for binding

- 3 1/2 fabric yards for backing
- 57" x 72" piece of batting
- Suggest Ruler: Curved Slotted Ruler, CGRKA4 by Creative Grids
